

Tdap vaccine is required for students entering 6th grade in the fall.

Meningitis vaccine is required for students entering 7th grade in the fall.

Providers and pediatricians will notify you of such during your child's annual physical examination and these are NYS mandated in order for your child to attend school.

If your student is in need of these vaccines for next year an informational flyer from the CDC will be sent home this week. If you received a notice and your child already received the required vaccination send in documentation of administration to the Health Office as soon as possible.


